Dear Residents,

I attended the Oak Village Association Board of Directors meeting on Monday February 8 where President Jim Smith announced that he had recently received a letter from NCRS Disposal Inc announcing a new proposed service offering for twice a week garbage pickup. The letter read as follows:

RE: Twice A Week Garbage Service

Dear Mr. Smith,

As per our conversation last week and the numerous calls we have received regarding the lack of twice a week garbage pickup, we have decided that we will begin offering this service to your community as well as the rest of Sugarmill Woods. At this time we will not be offering a recycling program, but may do so in the near future. If we do, it will not affect the twice a week service. We do offer twice a month Yard Waste service at a slight additional charge.

We will start enrolling new customers immediately with the first scheduled twice a week pickup beginning March 1, 2010.

As with all other garbage haulers, we do bill for three months in advance, but we do not hold any resident to a contract or charge cancellation fees. We do allow for vacation credits with advance notice and a minimum four consecutive week stop.

The cost for twice a week service will be \$57.00 per quarter. The optional twice a month Yard Waste service will be an additional \$5.00 or \$62.00 per quarter. There are no additional fuel charges, environmental fees or taxes. Any cancellations will receive a full refund of the unused portion of their unpaid amount.

Thank you for your call and I hope we can be of service to your community.

I spoke with Mr. Pszanka and he explained why they recently changed their mind and decided to offer twice a week household garbage pickup. I wanted to make you aware of this new development in the spirit of keeping you informed. If you want more information about this new service offering, please contact NCRS offices directly at their number listed above.

As I have stated before, it is your decision as a resident of Sugarmill Woods which garbage hauler you choose. Independent of this development, I am asking and will continue to ask that all SMW residents actively participate in a Recycling Program. The simple facts are we can reduce our household waste volume going to the landfill by 50 to 60% or more if we recycle, the more we recycle the longer we can extend the life of our current landfill, extending the life of our landfill delays the time before we will have to start transporting our garbage out of the county and forcing us to look for someone else to take it, the longer we can delay this action we hold down future costs for all of us.

If you don't Recycle yet, I strongly urge you to please re-consider and start Recycling now. If you do Recycle, thank you for doing so. I hope you encourage all of your friends and neighbors to Recycle as well.

If your waste hauler of choice does not support residential pickup of recyclables, please make arrangements to take your recyclables to one of the Citrus County Recycling Drop Off Centers (i.e. Lion's Club in Homosassa Springs) or to the Hernando County Waste Management Facility on US 98.

If your waste hauler of choice does support residential pickup of recyclables, please take advantage of the service offering and use it.

We all need to do our part to protect our environment for future generations. Your support and cooperation will be appreciated.
