The workshop will be held on **Thursday, April 14, 2011 from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM at the Sugarmill Woods Country Club**.

We will have various stations again this year where you can speak with and listen to experts cover a wide variety of topics. You may come any time between the hours of 1:00 PM and 4:00 PM and visit the station(s) of interest to you. This is not a sit down type meeting. Come for 20 for minutes or stay longer. It is your decision but please come. Planned Exhibitors and Representatives available to meet with you are listed below.

Debra Burden, Water Conservation Coordinator -- Water Conservation inside the home addressing water usage for dishwashers, clothes washers, showers, etc. and water wasted due to leaking faucets, toilets, etc. Advantages of solar water heaters, recommended temperature settings, etc. Know your Water Meter and how to read it periodically to check for leaks in the System. Track your water usage bills monthly to make sure you know how much you are using and you are not surprised unexpectedly with leaks. What Rebates are available?

Doug Staples, Sales Representative of John Deere -- Soil Moisture Sensor(s) for Irrigation Systems is the hottest new idea to manage irrigation. What are Soil Moisture Sensors, how do they work, what is the cost of the unit(s) including installation? Ask about Rebates available from the County to use toward covering the costs.

Dr. Joan Bradshaw, Extension Service Director -- Irrigation / Water Conservation Practices / Rebates addressing outdoor applications / various irrigation systems, controllers, sprinkler heads, drip systems, and the advantages of each, what should be used where and why, etc.

Audrey Durr, Florida Yards & Neighbors Coordinator -- Tutorial on Different Grass Types, the Pros and Cons of each, what is recommended for soil types in our community, etc.

Regina Hamilton, Program Assistant & Norah Hastings, Cypress Village Landscaper -- Florida Friendly Landscaping, what are recommended types of plantings for our environment, etc.

Matt Lenhardt, Extension Agent Horticulturist -- Tutorial on Different Fertilizers and Insecticides, Pros and Cons of each, what is the proper schedule and timing for applying fertilizers, insecticides, weed control, etc to achieve a healthy lawn and healthy plants, shrubs, and trees.

Cara Martin, SWFWMD Community Affairs Program Manager -- What is SWFWMD doing to help residents, latest status of watering restrictions, water tables, helpful watering techniques, Rebates, Variance Applications including the one for Soil Moisture Sensors, and more.
